Junior Scholarship Program - 2010

Describe in detail the criteria used in selecting scholarship recipients

1. Only WJHA members shall be eligible for or receive scholarship fund from this program.
2. Eligible education programs shall be full-time 1, 2, 3, or 4 year “degree type” education program, which would result in a baccalaureate or “tech” degree. (This specifically includes courses such as one-year LPN or Automotive Tech degrees grant from the Wisconsin Technical College System.) The “college” need not be located in Wisconsin.
3. A member of the WJHA may apply for and receive this scholarship as long as they are a member of the WJHA. (This is not restricted to just seniors in high school in anticipation of freshmen year in college.) Thus, an individual may apply in more than one year.
4. The WJHA and WPHA has committed to a funding level of \$1400 per year. This will be divided between the individuals selected. Two scholarships will be awarded. The break down will be 60% to first place and 40% to second place
 - a. If the individual wins and receives the 60%, they are not eligible to compete in the future.
 - b. If the individual wins and receives the 40%, they are eligible to compete for another scholarship until they receive the 60%
 - c. If there is only one applicant, the individual will receive 60% and the 40% will go into a scholarship fund that can be used at a later date.
5. There shall be no gender differentiation among applicant or awardees.
6. Selection of awardees based on the following factors shall be done by a committee, which shall be appointed by the WPHA board. In recognition of the fact that flexibility in this situation is more valuable than pre-determined formulas, no required or suggested weighting of the following factors shall be provided the selection committee. The factors to be considered are:
 - a. Involvement in the WJHA and in Hereford activities. While life-long accomplishment shall be considered, recent activity level shall receive greater consideration
 - b. Leadership- in both WJHA and other school/community organizations.
 - c. Community service
 - d. Grade point and other evidence of academic achievement
 - e. Job or other activities demonstrating effort to provide funding for educational plans
 - f. Economic need shall be considered, but is not established as the primary determinant

The process shall include:

1. The applicant submitting a paper to the committee which details their educational plans and presents such other information as the applicant feels appropriate given both points. This paper shall also address (at any length the applicant feel appropriate) a topic selected that year by the committee. How had you involvement in Hereford activities prepared you for the future?

2. An interview of the applicant by the committee. The interview will take place during the Friday before the open show at the Wisconsin State Fair.
3. Award winners will be announced at the open Herford Show of the Wisconsin State Fair.
4. Awards will be paid after completion of the Fall Semester with a certified transcript from the college documenting at least a 2.0 GPA for that semester. It is the responsibility of the award winner to provide the transcript to the junior advisor.
